ENFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

Wearing of the school uniform is compulsory for students attending Enfield Primary School. New school uniform items were phased in during 2014. Every child is to comply with the new policy from January 2015.

The School Governing Council has ratified the following policy:

School Colours Maroon and gold

Unisex (Boys and Girls)

Maroon and gold polo top and maroon and gold jacket with school logo. A black skivvy may be worn under school polo top. Plain black shorts or black pants. Pants must be plain with no striping or artwork. Hooded tops and jeans are not permitted.

Girls

Red and white checked dress, black netball skirts with black bike pants or black skorts (shorts with skirt front). Shorts, skirts and dresses must be of a suitable length for physical activity.

Year 6 Commemorative Uniform

Maroon and gold polo school top and maroon and gold Boss Top screen printed with new seniors' design each year. Orders are placed at the beginning of each school year.

Hats

Maroon wide brim or bucket style school hats with logo are to be worn from 1st September to the 30th April and at other times time when the UV factor is 3 or more.

Footwear

Appropriate footwear should be worn every day. Children participate in daily fitness activities and require safe supportive shoes. No thongs or Crocs. Sandals must be appropriate for participation in PE and fitness lessons. E.g. sturdy and stop the foot from slipping forward.

Jewellery

Jewellery (rings, bracelets and chains) are not permitted to be worn. Earrings are acceptable as long as they are studs or small sleepers. Teachers reserve the right to ask children to remove any earrings they consider to be dangerous, especially for PE lessons. School personnel take no responsibility for any lost jewellery.

Makeup / Hair Colour

Makeup, nail polish and hair dye are not permitted at school unless approved for a school event such as Sports Day, Harmony Day or Casual Day.

General Guidelines

All clothing should be worn in an appropriate manner to ensure full engagement in all aspects of learning and play. Any inappropriate wearing of the uniform will be followed up by the leadership staff. All uniform items must be clearly labelled with the child's name.

Second-hand Uniforms

A limited supply of second-hand items is available from the front office at reduced prices. Donations of second-hand uniform items are accepted at the front office.

New Students

Students transferring from another school will be allowed to continue wearing their previous school uniform for period of time as negotiated with the principal.

Lost Property

A lost property container is situated inside the southern entrance to the Red Unit. Items not collected by the end of each term will be added to the school's second-hand supplies.

Exemptions

Principals may exempt students, for a period of time, from wearing the uniform. Requests would need to be in writing and would require exceptional circumstances for an exemption to be approved.
